

What We Recommend for Cats

- All kittens should receive a complete series of vaccinations during their first 6 months of life.
- Cats should receive appropriate booster vaccinations one year after the final vaccines in the kitten series, excluding kittens that showed serious side effects from any earlier vaccination.
- All cats should have an annual physical. A thorough physical will help you and your veterinarian decide what is the best health care regimen for your pet, depending on its risk factors.

This will include:

- What other vaccines might be appropriate, including FeLV and FIV disease.
- Your pet's body condition and what type of food your pet should be on,
- Which current external parasite control is best for your cat.
- Blood work – either a senior panel for cats over 7 or a junior panel for those under 7.
- Urinalysis
- Fecal testing for internal parasites for cats that are outside.
- Current state of oral health.
- Dental cleaning should be scheduled as indicated by the findings of the physical.
- Basic dental care for healthy gums or mild gingivitis should include:
 - Brushing teeth every 2-3 days.
 - CET chews
